



Technical Commissions and Championships GENERAL REGULATIONS of CSIT

**Updated and carried out during the
CSIT General Assembly
Vantaa (Finland)
On August 9th, 2003**



A/ PREAMBLE

Definition and objectives of the CSIT Championships:

1. The all CSIT Unions members and other organisations which CSIT has signed co-operation agreements with - such as CCPADET - are expected to participate in the CSIT championships. So that, regulations must promote the participation of every Union whatever their levels of practice are;
2. CSIT championships has to propose adapted number of events (matches, games) to each participant according to his real level of practice;
3. Duration and agenda of the stay have to reach the best conditions of relations and knowledge between participants (sportsmen, coaches, referees, managers): friendly informal sports practices (outside the very championship) and relations outside the sports activities (meals, visits and evenings).
4. The stay has to develop the best possible contacts between the sportsmen of the host Union and country and the participating Unions' delegations (the presence of the host Union' sportsmen during all the moments of the stay is one of the important elements to make the championship successful).
5. In order to avoid anonymity and promote connections between the good international amateur competition and local sport for all activities, CSIT recommends the organising Union to hold complementary local and/or national sports events at the same time and place of the championship (in honour of the Union members and/or local people)

B/ RECOMMENDATIONS

A) Quality of the accommodation:

The CSIT championship organiser Union has to arrange the best possible coherence between:

- Comfortable accommodation (but not luxurious) with individual beds as much as possible;
- Meals of quality adapted for sportsmen, taking into account the diversity of culture of the participants
- Sports facilities corresponding to the criteria of the competition according to the standard of the country;
- Schedules adapted to the constraints of the possible local transport and the usual duration of competitions;
- Additional free time (out of the competition) favouring relations among the participants and knowledge of the host Union and country;

The most optimal solution could be as following: lodging, meal and sports facilities on the same site (not requiring a transport)

B) General conception of the competitions:

The rules of the competition have to refer to the following criteria:

- The quantity of practice (number of games, fights, contests) must be optimal for every participant (neither excess for sportsmen amateurs, nor too much little). Particularly the competition cannot be made of "direct elimination".
- The all stay mustn't be devoted to the competition. The regulations of the TC has to plan necessarily times to reach the other objectives of the CSIT: to increase social links among participants, to meet the sportsmen of the host Union and the other people who live in the country.
- Levels of practice must be adapted to each participant. The CSIT competitions have to offer various levels so that each participant can have fun and improve his abilities.

C) To know and understand better each other amongst participants

- CSIT recommends to favour relations between the diverse delegations from the arrival day: the starting welcome evening should promote first contacts = Example: mixing delegations at the time of the first dinner, according to weight category in wrestling, judo, karate; track & field disciplines families (throwers, jumpers, short-distance runners, half-distance runners); age categories; etc.
- CSIT recommends to hold (during the stay whatever before - between - after the very championship, according to the possibilities) an informal friendly competition by mixing the delegations either in the sport of the championship, or another sport as the case may be. Participation of the coaches, referees and managers who are interested in such activity should be promoted.



CSIT recommends to end the stay getting up an entertainment and cultural evening in honour of all the participants

D) To favour knowledge about the organising union, promote links with the local people and avoid anonymity:

- At the same championship' facility (or near), CSIT recommends the organiser Union to implement sporting mass events (within the same sport or other ones) = Example: open tournaments towards local people and/or national/regional official championship of the Union, activities with school, with workers, unemployed persons, handicapped persons, etc. - whatever the organiser Union chooses and decides.
- During the stay. CSIT recommends to favour relations between those local population, &/or national sportsmen's organiser Union and the CSIT championship's participating delegations = Example: visits in schools or sporting clubs of the organiser Union, common practice when sport allows it, common award ceremonies, adaptation of the time schedule in order to favour attendance of the local people, etc
- CSIT recommends the attendance of the organising Union's members (participating in the CSIT championship) during the all stay related to the championship (accommodation, meals, visits) in order to increase relations with the participating delegations and help those ones to appreciate the town and host country better " than amongst "foreign people" only.

C/ CSIT TECHNICAL COMMISSION REGULATIONS

Technical Commissions' role

1. General framework

Organising Unions of CSIT championships or other competitive or non competitive sports events and Technical Commissions are taking into consideration goals stemmed from history, aims and practices of CSIT. CSIT activities have to promote "the right of each human people to practice his own choice of sport, whatever his social condition of life and level of practice are" (see the statues of CSIT). The aims of the activities are not at all the results of the competition than quality of co-operations and progress between participants, democratic management of the activities, solidarity between competitors, conception of regulations where everyone can participate without elimination, taking into account diversity of sportsmen levels (see the preamble).

2. Technical Commissions functions

- To determine contents of the CSIT corresponding sports events and promote exchange of experience between CSIT (and COPADET) Unions, relating to the corresponding sport discipline culture;
- To write out sporting rules and championships' (and other events managed by the TC) regulation adapted to the CSIT goals.
- To establish a championship's (and possibly other events) calendar together with the CSIT (and COPADET) Unions in co-ordination with the other Technical Commissions;
- To ensure the management of the championships (or other events) is being held according to the TC specific regulations;

Creation of a Technical Commission

3. Only one commission manages each sport or sports family. CSIT Congresses or General Assemblies decide of the creation of the Technical Commission.

4. Creation of a commission will be decided after the following process:

Two opportunities are opened to the Unions:

- Either to hold a meeting where every CSIT Union is invited to share information about ways of working and needs regarding the corresponding sport and prepare a first proposal of a CSIT event.
- Or to invite Unions to take part in a national open event which could support a discussion about the conception of a future championship (or event). An informal meeting will be held at the same time to establish the interest of the attending Unions to implement a new Technical Commission.

After that stage:



Corresponding Unions (at least 4) can make a proposal of establishment of such new Technical Commission including setting up a first championship and pre-registration of Unions to be sent to the TC Co-ordinator.

- The proposal shall be studied during the following G.A. or Congress, taking into account the Executive Committee's opinion (which gets the global sight of CSIT activities) in addition of the corresponding Unions' interest.

In case of an agreement:

- The TC Co-ordinator is in charge of inviting a first new TC meeting (in accordance with an interested Union to hold it), and of managing the works.
- This meeting should write out the first championship regulations of that corresponding sport, prepare a future events' calendar (towards next years), and elect a president and secretary until the next CSIT Congress.

Technical Commission membership

5. The members of the TC are those managers in charge of the corresponding sport within each Union (one per union).
6. The members of the TC are necessarily sent and supported by their Union.
7. The TC president updates the members' list and sends it to the TC co-ordinator.
8. Heads of delegations during CSIT championships, who are not member of the TC, attend the meeting but do not take part in the decisions, except if they have an official permit from their Union.
9. TC members elect a president and a secretary among themselves for 3 years (see election chapter).
10. Relating to a "family sports" Commission (as an example "Gymnastics" which includes GAM, GAP, GR, Acrogym, General Gym, Gymnascopia), each Union is allowed to send a member per "sub-discipline".
11. Within such case, TC members can elect deputy-presidents - in charge of each sub discipline - (see election chapter).

Technical Commissions management

12. CSIT recognises specificity to each Commission according to its sports characteristics. So that, each Commission manages and writes out its own regulations under certain autonomy (while respecting CSIT statutes and general regulations of the TC).
13. The TC holds a meeting prior and after the competition during the championship's period of time. PRIOR in order to check the competition and programme of the stay, and inform the participant delegations / AFTER in order to evaluate the championship and implement the TC work.
14. More, the TC can meet at any time when necessary according to the needs of the management and organisation of the championships and sports events under its responsibility.
15. Relating to a "family sports" Commission, a specific meeting of one of the sub-discipline can be held under the responsibility of the corresponding deputy-president.
16. Meetings are valid when four (4) Unions members at least are taking part in it, including the president or the secretary.
17. The working of the commission must guaranty that decision should be taken with 'he participation of the greatest number of Unions, as well as the TC co-ordinator as Executive Committee member.
18. Executive Committee members take part in TC meetings as much as possible.
19. TC 's president and Secretary are in charge of the working of the TC.
20. They can request voting by mail in case of need to take decision with the greatest number of Unions (except for the election of president and secretary). At least four (4) Unions should send their opinion.
21. The invitation to the meeting must be sent by the Secretary at least three (3) months before the meeting to:



- the Technical Commission members
- the CSIT Unions members (COPADET and other co-operation CSIT partners)
- the co-ordinator of the TC and Executive Committee members
- the CSIT administrative office

The invitation requests TC and Unions members proposals in order to draft the agenda of the meeting. The TC members and Unions must send their proposals at least one month before the TC meeting. Then the secretary establishes the agenda according to the received proposals and in coordination with the TC president. He sends the agenda to the TC members as soon as possible before the meeting.

22. TC members who are prevented to attend a meeting are allowed to send a substitute supported by the same Union or send his opinion about the issues on the agenda by mail.
23. The TC can take decisions by consensus or vote. In such case, decisions are valid by simple majority votes of the members who are attending the meeting. In case of equality, the president's vote prevails-
24. The TC Secretary sends the minutes of the meeting to the TC members with a copy to the TC Co-ordinator and CSIT administrative office at the latest one (1) month after the meeting. CSIT secretary sends the minutes to all the CSIT Unions, COPADET office (which should send it to its Unions members) and Executive Committee members.

Technical Commissions Annual Assembly

25. Every TC has to co-ordinate its own work with the other ones by participating in Technical Commissions' Assembly at the time of a G.A. or Congress once a year.
26. President and/or secretary of each Commission must take part in this annual Assembly (sent by the Union they stem from). Both attendance is highly recommended.
27. The TC Assembly's agenda is being prepared by an "inter-Commissions & Unions working group" under the responsibility of the co-ordinator of the TC.
28. The TC co-ordinator (assisted by one or several TC members) chairs the annual TC Assembly's works.

Technical Commissions specific regulations

29. Each commission writes out specific regulations, which cannot depart from the CSIT statutes, and the present general regulation of Technical Commissions.
30. This specific TC regulations must follow up the CSIT aims and take into consideration the Unions participants' characteristics. In default of such specific regulations, the TC refers to the corresponding International Sporting Federation regulations.
31. Specific TC regulations must favour achievement and progress of every participant, within the framework of an open sport for all development. They contribute to promote the corresponding sport discipline through setting up of exchanges of experiences between Unions, such as training of referees, coaches, sportsmen abilities improvement (in particular exchanges between the most experimented Unions and those who are facing a lack of meanings and experiences - improving solidarity' spirit and mutual knowledge)
32. Specific case of possible participation of high level CSIT Unions members sportsmen and women has to respect the following general frame: a specific category of such level of practice should be created in order to guaranty all sportsmen interest (whatever their level are) to participate in a spirit of brotherly competition and co-operation. Then, the programme of the stay has to stimulate strong links amongst high level sportsmen and the other sportsmen's categories, particularly outside the competition (informal games, visits, evenings)

Elections

33. Each commission elects one president and one secretary, amongst its members. In case of "family sports" Commission, deputy-presidents in charge of each sub-discipline can be elected.
34. Elections take place every three years during the last TC meeting before the CSIT Congress.
35. If the TC could not hold a meeting during the year of the Congress - and before it - the election must be held at the first meeting following the congress and necessarily during the following year at the latest. In such case, the president and secretary remain on position until the new election.



36. The election process would be either a vote by show of hands (if there is only one candidate and if no one of the TC members requests for a secret vote) or a secret vote when there are several candidates or if one (1) of the TC members at least requests it.
37. To be elected, a candidate must get the simple majority of the present members' votes. Vote by correspondence for elections of president and secretary is not valid.
38. To be valid, a minimum of four (4) Unions must take part in the election.
39. Results of the elections are published in the minutes of the meeting and distributed as lay down in article 24. Then it will be ratified during the Congress by the TC Coordinator,
40. In case of president or secretary 's resignation before the end of the mandate, a new election will be held during the next TC meeting. The remaining elected person stands in. The result of the new election will be ratified during the following CSIT G.A. or Congress.
41. Presidents and secretaries are re-eligible

Presidents and Secretaries' Role

42. The president:

- manages relations between the TC, Unions members and the TC Co-ordinator
- looks after new organising Unions for futures championships
- is responsible for the good management of the championship in general
- chairs the Technical Commission meetings
- is in charge of promoting development of the corresponding sport within CSIT
- supervises the drafting, updating and implementation of the specific TC regulations
- takes part in priority in CSIT General Assemblies and Congresses
- keeps in touch closely with the TC secretary

43. The secretary:

- sends out invitations and agendas of the Technical Commissions meetings
- sends out the minutes of the TC meetings
- is responsible for verification and sending out of the championships' results.
- is in charge of updating and spreading of the specific TC regulations
- keeps in order TC archives and championships results / records
- takes part in CSIT General Assemblies and Congresses
- substitutes the president if necessary

Technical Commissions funding

44. The organising Union takes charge of the costs of the meeting
45. Participating Unions take charge of their travel costs' representatives
46. In order to take charge of full board accommodation, the organising Union can request the participants of a financial contribution of 34 Euro per day per person maximum. Only a CSIT congress can change this amount as written in the statutes.
47. Each Technical Commission gets a financial support from the CSIT budget of a total maximum amount of 510 Euro per year, as a contribution to the TC work (mails, telephone, travel expenses of the president or secretary in order to ensure the good progress of championships and meetings of the TC). Only a CSIT congress can change this amount as written in the statutes.
48. This financial support is paid to one or the other union (or divide between both of them) that takes charge of TC presidency and/or secretary. A report must be send to the treasurer of the CSIT before March 31st of the following year in order to get this amount. Decision to give the amount to one or the other Union (or divide into both of them) is taken during the TC meeting.



D/ CSIT CHAMPIONSHIPS REGULATIONS

Who can participate in / and to organise CSIT championships

1. As a principle, organising and participating in CSIT championships are devoted to the CSIT members unions.
2. The "Observer Members Unions" are also invited to participate in the championships. Furthermore, they can organise a CSIT championship when there is no candidate amongst the regular CSIT Unions members.
3. The COPADET Unions members (according to the partnership's agreement signed between COPADET and CSIT) - and possibly future other CSIT partners - can participate in CSIT championships. Invitations must be sent to the COPADET office in Mexico City which takes care sending it to its unions members.
4. According to the interest of CSIT, the Executive Committee can decide to give the opportunity to a COPADET member (possible future similar CSIT partners) to hold a CSIT championship when they send a candidature.
5. The organiser's Unions can invite non affiliated CSIT (or COPADET) federations to participate in a CSIT championship in the framework of an "open" category " with the aim of developing CSIT. Such guests must be necessarily a national "multi-sports" federation or affiliated to such umbrella organisation in their country, (in order to respect CSIT statutes' spirit).
6. At least 4 (four) Unions members must participated in a CSIT championship. In case of a lower number of participants, the championship can take place, but without publication of an official CSIT classification.

Implantation / Calendar

7. Technical Commissions decide the Union which is responsible to hold the corresponding CSIT championship, according to proposals of places and dates made by the Unions. CSIT annual General Assemblies and Congresses give the opportunity to make regulated and official the annual championships' calendar.
8. In case of needs the TC co-ordinator is responsible to develop relations among TC and the Unions in order to favour the implementation of championships.
9. According to the evolution of needs and financial meanings of the participating Unions, each TC makes proposals regarding championships or events' rhythm (every year, every other year, categories of ages, etc.). However the decision to hold a new championship or event must be discussed during the TC Assembly and confirmed by CSIT G.A. / Congress.
10. To apply for the organisation of a championship, the Unions have to fill the application form concerning the organisation of a CSIT event. They have to send it in due course (as soon as possible) to the secretary of the corresponding Technical Commission with a copy to the co-ordinator of the TC and the CSIT secretariat' office.
11. The decisions of championships allocation to the Unions are taken by the concerned Technical Commission.



Invitations - preparatory stage of the championship

12. When decision has been taken, the organiser Union has to send the official invitation to all the CSIT Unions and COPADET head office, at least 9 (nine) months before the championship.
13. This invitation includes the following information, which necessarily respect the corresponding specific TC regulations - (notably duration of the stay and description of the delegations) - see model in appendix-
 - precise name of the championship (discipline - categories of ages and sex)
 - city where the championship takes place
 - welcome place of the delegations (airport and railway station)
 - residence place (if possible)
 - distance and means of transport between the nearest airport and the town of the championship, if this one is different (& possible cost for the participating delegations)
 - arrival date of the delegations
 - departure date of the delegations
 - information meeting' date (for the TC members, heads of delegations and referees) concerning the competition and programme - to be held at the beginning of the stay
 - Technical Commission meeting' date - to be held at the end of the stay
 - maximum number of members within the official delegation (according to the specific regulation of the corresponding Technical Commission)
 - registration fee amount (per sportsman) fixed by the organiser Union (which cannot exceed the amount fixed by the present general regulation (*see article n ° 30 below*))
 - financial contribution amount for meals and lodging per day per person (which cannot exceed the amount fixed by the present general regulation (*see article n ° 30 below*))
 - bank account references and payment terms (*see article no 15 below*)
 - deadline of preliminary registration - 3 months before the championship
 - deadline of definitive registration - 1 month before the championship
 - Name, address, phone number of the Union organising committee's chairman
 - Preliminary registration form (see model in appendix)
 - Definitive registration form (see model in appendix)
14. After reception of the preliminary registrations and with the TC president and/or secretary's agreement, the organiser Union has to send an additional information notice to all the CSIT unions and COPADET office, including notably:
 - Preliminary registration Unions' list (and the number of participants)
 - Residence(s) for accommodation (including name - address - telephone - description)
 - A programme of the stay including sports activities, social aspects, cultural events - possibly other initiatives held at a local level by the organiser Union beside the CSIT championship
 - All the necessary information to facilitate the delegation Journey, (map including of competition halls or stadiums, place (one or several) of residence, reception place of the delegations who travel by road. any concerned places during the stay (visits, evenings) and regional map for the delegations who travel by road.
15. Organiser Union can request - at the time of the preliminary registration - participating Unions to pay a deposit which cannot exceed 50 % of the total amount to be overturned -and the remainder at the time of the definitive registration - (banking charges chargeable to the participating Union)
16. Unions which intend to participate in a championship have to send the preliminary registration form duly filled 3 months before the championship at the latest together with the corresponding possible deposit required by the organiser Union. In case of reception of a preliminary registration form beyond the delay, the organiser Union is allowed to cancel the registration.
17. Pre-registered Unions must send their definitive registration form (and remainder amount) at the latest 1 month before the date of the championship. The organiser Union keeps right to refuse the participation of one Union which did not respect the registration deadline. In that case, the organiser Union is allowed to keep on the deposit possibly paid by the corresponding Union.



18. The participant Unions to the championships must send a copy of their preliminary and definitive registration forms simultaneously to:

- The organiser Union (according to address supplied in the invitation)
- The president and the secretary of the concerned technical commission
- The co-ordinator of the technical commissions
- The administrative office of CSIT

19. Invitations and forms must be drafted in both CSIT official languages: French and English-

Requirements for the organiser Union

20. The organiser Union is in charge of the preparation and organisation of the championship.

21. It works permanently under the responsibility of the president and the secretary of the corresponding Technical Commission;

- During the preparatory phase, the organiser Union keeps in contact regularly with the president and the secretary to make sure correct implementation of the TC regulations.
- During the championship, the person in charge of the Union organiser committee and the TC president and secretary manage together the whole programme of the stay and the competition.

22. The organiser Union is in charge of:

- Making available sports facilities and material corresponding to the TC specific regulations (regarding as well as training and competition)
- Making available conference rooms needed for the programme of the stay and the technical commission works (including a room for a possible doping control according to the current legislation in the country)
- Booking full board accommodation taking into account the diverse cultures of the participants for the meals
- Setting up the appropriate procedures in order to facilitate the visas entry issue to the all registered Unions' delegations when necessary
- Preparing a program of the stay according to the recommendations of the present general regulation
- Receiving the delegations at the airport (if it is located in the same city where the Championship takes place) and/or the railway station
- Setting up a collective transport (in charge of to the participating Unions) between the nearest airport and the city where the championship takes place when necessary
- Taking care of the transport of the delegations on the spot during all the stay.
- Making sure of interpreters' attendance (volunteers and not necessary professional!) - in French and English as a minimum - and within all the languages of the participants if possible - in particular during the information meeting at the beginning of the stay and during the TC meeting at the end. And possibly during all the stay.
- Making available a secretariat for the competition (computer - photocopier - staff) in order to manage the competition and print settling of results in a proper way.
- Being insured in civil liability for the organisation of the championship (see below § H/ insurance)
- Making the necessary arrangements for a doctor attendance or first aid assistance during all the stages of competition (on site)
- Promoting the championship and CSIT toward local authorities

Welcoming and taking care of the delegation

23. The organiser Union is invited to pay all the necessary attention to welcome the delegations in good conditions: reception by a representative of the organiser Union at the arrival; acting as a courier to the delegations all through the stay until the departure by a member of the organiser Union (if possible a person who speaks the corresponding delegation's language)

24. The organiser Union has to propose the same conditions of residence to the all delegations (if possible one single residence). In case of impossibility, the different residences have to be of an



identical or comparable quality and as much as possible close to each other as well as close to the place of competition. In every case members of a same delegation must be necessarily accommodated in the same place of residence.

Role of the president and the secretary of the TC during the championship

25. President and secretary are in charge of the exact implementation of the specific and general TC regulations; and assist the organiser Union in its task.
26. They are particularly concerned by:
 - Controlling the competitor's membership union card and identity (control of the passport or Identity cards) if necessary; this control must be made before the beginning of the Championship
 - Controlling classifications and settling of results.
 - Implementing the right progress of the competition (setting up of results along the competition, information to the speaker and to the leaders of delegations)
 - The committee of appeal works, in case of dispute (see referee chapter)
 - The organisation and the chairmanship of the Technical Commission meeting

Financing of championships

27. The participating Unions have to cover their travel expenses until the city where the championship takes place:
 - till the place of residence in case of travelling by road;
 - until the city championship's railway station, when that is the case;
 - until the city championship's airport when that is the case;
28. If the championship takes place in a town without an airport, the participating Union has to take care and charge of its travel until the town of the championship. However the organiser Union has to propose a collective transport (bus or train) between the nearest airport and the town where the championship take place - transport to be paid by the participating Union.
29. The organiser Unions have to cover the championships' setting up expenses:
 - Sports facilities and material needed for the championship
 - Sporting rewards
 - Local transport during the stay (welcome in airports and railway stations, transportation between place of competition and residence(s), cultural and tourist program's transportation)
 - Residences and meals (including at least one (1) drink)
30. To cover these expenses, the organiser Union can request the participating Unions:
 - On one hand, a financial contribution of a 34 Euro per day per person maximum (from every delegation members whatever they are: sportsman, coaches, referees or head of delegation). So, this amount can be situated between 0 (in case the organiser Union decides to take charge of all expenses) and 34 maximum
 - On the other hand. a registration fee of a 7 Euro per sportsman maximum (as a contribution to the rewards cost, in particular).

Insurance

31. The organiser Union must be insured in civil liability for the organisation of the championship.
32. Participating Unions must be sure that their participants have got an individual health and accident insurance as well as a repatriation assistance contract.

Refereeing and Committee of appeal



33. Every Technical Commission decides the conditions of refereeing during the championship, according to the specificity of each sport discipline.
34. A committee of appeal will be established during every championship according to the specific TC regulations, or in default of, according to the corresponding International Sports Federation's rules.



35. The referees have to be member of their CSIT Union and graduated by their Union. National or international referees (member of the national or international federations) can participate in refereeing CSIT championships after a session of information (and/or examination) relating to the specific TC regulations.
36. The organiser Union has to supply the referees' equipment and materials needed for the championship refereeing.
37. An updating and information meeting relating to refereeing (about specific TC rules and/or the International Federation ones) must be held at least before the beginning of every championship with the attendance of referees, under the responsibility of the TC president or secretary, information from that meeting must be communicated to all the heads of delegations, coaches and captains before the beginning of the competition.

Awards

38. The first three classified competitors participating in a CSIT championship (whatever it is individual and/or team championship) obtain a CSIT medal: gold to the first, silver to the second, and bronze to the third. In case of team championship, every competitor, as well as the coach and the leader of delegation get the same medal.
39. The CSIT medal has to seize 5 centimetres (diameter). On one face, the CSIT logo; on the other face, the sport discipline, place and date of the championship and the organising Union name or logo.
40. The organiser Union is in charge of manufacturing and funding the CSIT medals. It can ask for a financial contribution from the participating Unions of a maximum amount of 7 Euro by sportsman (*see item n° 30*) to do so.
41. The participants can receive other awards (trophies, cups, medals, tee shins, etc.) according to the organiser Union possibilities and appreciation.
42. President, secretary and TC members take care of the awards ceremony which must take place as soon as possible after results classification have been established (according to the disciplines). Participation of local personalities is recommended.

Modifications

43. This General TC regulations can be modified only during CSIT General Assemblies and Congresses, after proposals have been sent to the Co-ordinator of the Technical Commissions, and being discussed during the annual Technical Commissions Assemblies.
